VISITATION POLICIES


The Family and Visitor's Area is open to all visitors. Please register with a Family Area Staff. The Country Store is open for your convenience. A full line of food, sundry and souvenir items is in stock. You may swim and boat from the Family Area beach if the proper permit forms are completed. Check with a staff member. A picnic area is maintained a short distance from the Family Resident area. Both East and West Camps are open to visitors Saturday and Sunday from 2:00 pm to 6:00 pm. You may visit program and general areas as well as your son's campsite during these hours.
